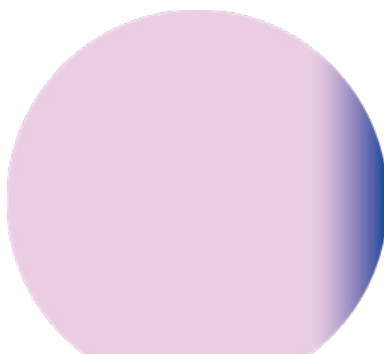

# Welcome message

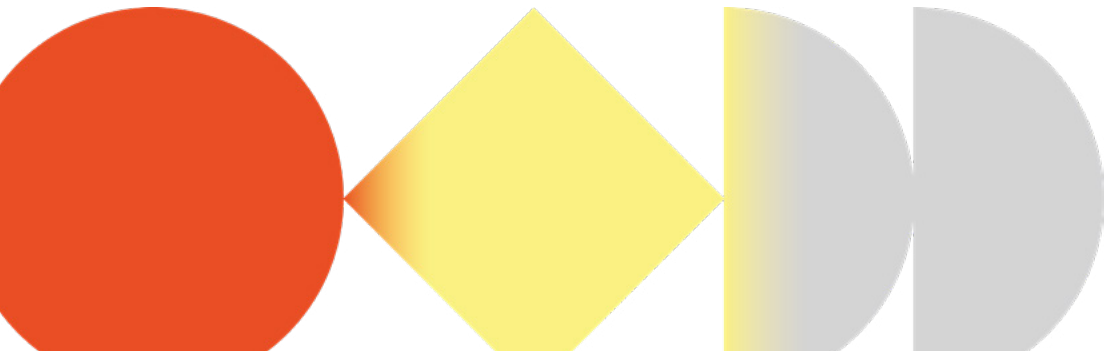


Dear Rectors, Colleagues, Students and Friends of the Una Europa community,

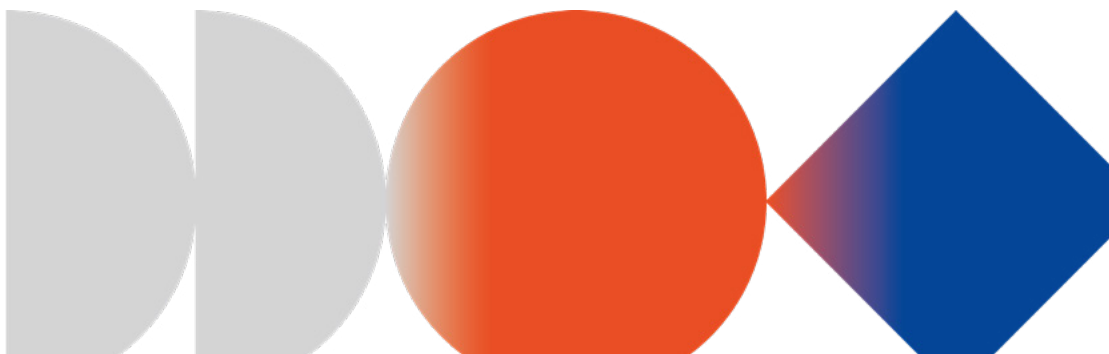
from external interference. As we gather today for the Una Europa General Assembly, we must keep in mind that it is in their collective nature that European universities alliances find their greatest strength.

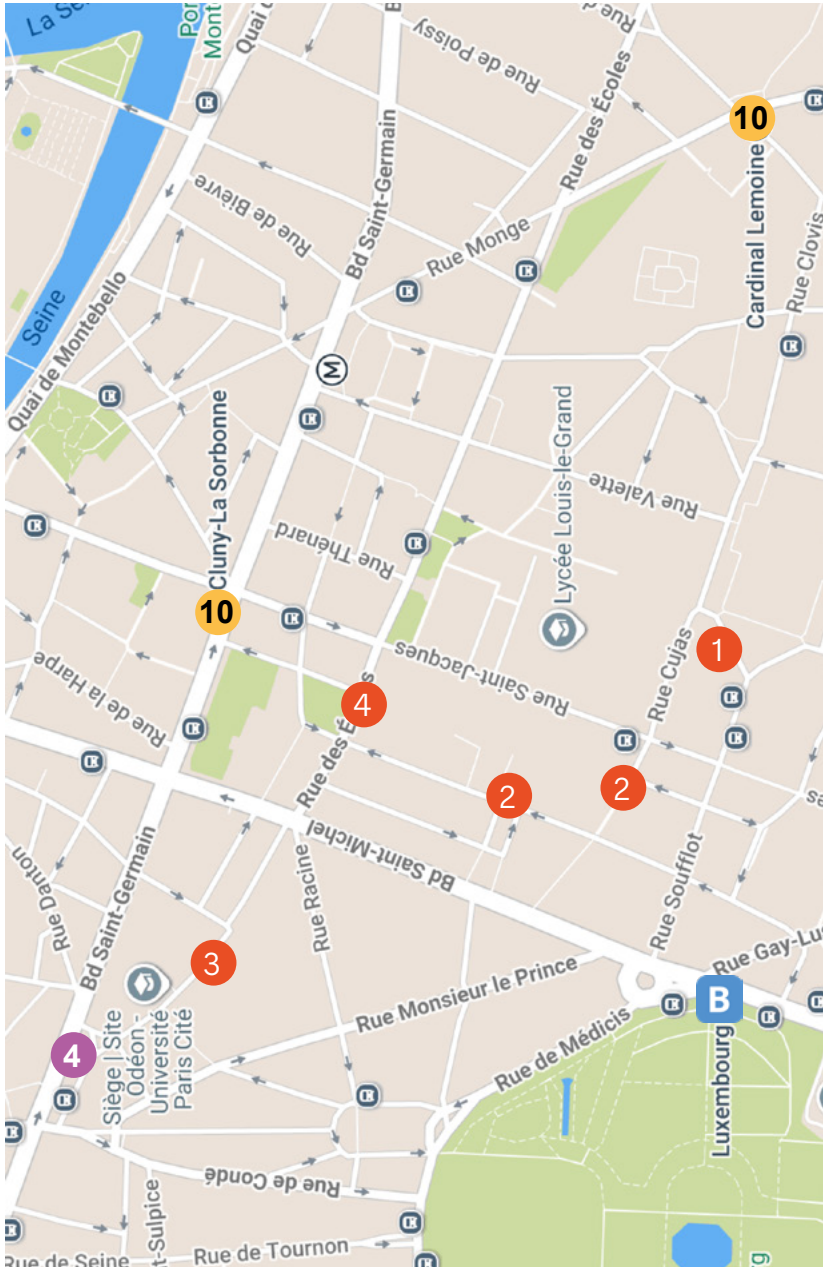

On the occasion of the General Assembly, Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne is pleased to host a roundtable entitled “Defending the Values of European Higher Education and Research: Inclusivity, Academic Freedom, and Democracy”, which will take place on 28 May from 16:30 to 18:00 in the Amphithéâtre Richelieu at the Sorbonne. At a time of global crises, European alliances safeguard and strengthen essential values of higher education and research. Their specific governance models, characterised by autonomy, collaboration, and consensus-building, position them as actors well placed to uphold these principles. Through their activities, the alliances promote the dissemination of knowledge, the free circulation of ideas, and contribute concretely to the emergence of a borderless European knowledge area. # Open Info Session, Real Life Data: Una Europa Joint Master in Applied Data Science

This event is mainly intended for students who want to discover the Una Europa Joint Master in Applied Data Science (MADS), a premier two-year, 120 ECTS international programme of the Una Europa Alliance. This event will outline the student-centred, challenge-based approach, where students tackle real-world problems within multidisciplinary teams alongside industry partners. By merging advanced technical skills with critical ethical awareness and soft competencies, MADS prepares students for a successful global career. We will showcase the four interdisciplinary specialisation tracks tailored to high-impact fields: Health, Behavioural Sciences, Legal Professions, and Cultural Heritage. Participants will learn about the Erasmus Mundus possibility, which offers full scholarships for top candidates and ensures mandatory mobility across partner universities in Spain, Italy, Ireland, Finland, the Netherlands, France, and Poland. Join us to explore how MADS bridges the digital skills gap among disciplines and empowers the next generation of specialists!



# Cultural programme

## Guided tour | Notre-Dame-de-Paris

Located in the historic heart of Paris and listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1991, Notre-Dame-de-Paris is France's most visited monument. The origins of the cathedral date back to the early Christian era, when King Clovis I made Paris a major religious centre in the 4th-5th century. A first cathedral, Saint-Étienne, once stood on this site before the current monument. In 1163, Bishop Maurice de Sully initiated the construction of a vast new cathedral to accommodate a growing population. Built during the 12th and 13th centuries, Notre-Dame-de-Paris became a masterpiece of Gothic architecture. In the 19th century, the success of Victor Hugo's novel *The Hunchback of Notre-Dame* led to a major restoration of the cathedral by architect Eugène Viollet-le-Duc, which significantly reshaped its appearance, including the addition of a new spire. Following the devastating fire of April 2019, which destroyed its roof and spire, a significant restoration project was undertaken, leading to its reopening in December 2024. The tour will focus on the cathedral's history, closely intertwined with the history of Paris and France, as well as on the evolution of its architecture over the centuries.

## Guided tour | Paris University History through the Latin Quarter

The Latin Quarter is one of the most visited areas of Paris. At the same time, it bears witness to the rich history of the University of Paris. During this tour, you will discover several key stages in this history: from the establishment of the University in the Middle Ages, in response to the democratization of teaching and learning and in contrast to the cathedral schools (notably Notre-Dame), to the construction of emblematic institutions such as the Sorbonne, the Schools of Law and Medicine, and, subsequently, the Collège de France, which played an important role in introducing new fields of study under the influence of Humanism. The tour will also highlight more recent developments, including the division into thirteen separate universities following the events of May 1968 and the formation of new academic alliances today. Particular attention will be given to the ways in which the history of the University has been closely intertwined with major historical events in Paris and France.

## Guided tour | The Sorbonne Library (BIS)

The Sorbonne Library (Bibliothèque Interuniversitaire Sorbonne) is a major research library specialising in Humanities and Social Sciences. Founded in 1763, and opened to the public in 1770, the library as it stands today has been established in the current Sorbonne buildings in 1897. The library holds about 2 million printed items and an extensive range of digital resources, mainly specialised in History, Geography, French Literature, Philosophy, and Classical Studies. The library also preserves an outstanding heritage collection, including manuscripts, incunabula, cartographic and iconographic archives, some of them dating back to the 10th century. The tour will include a visit to some of the library's most remarkable rooms, and a presentation of selected pieces from its prestigious heritage collection.

## French Discovery Walk in the Jardin du Luxembourg

Join an immersive French language discovery walk in the beautiful Jardin du Luxembourg. The Jardin du Luxembourg was commissioned by Marie de Médicis in the early 17th century and has evolved over the centuries. Inspired by the Italian Renaissance gardens of her native Florence, it later evolved into a more formal French style in the 19th century, featuring harmonious symmetry, long perspectives, and carefully designed geometric parterres. Today, it remains closely linked to the Luxembourg Palace, home to the French Senate. As you stroll through the park, you will learn useful everyday French through fun, interactive activities. You will practise introducing yourself, asking for directions, ordering a coffee, and handling simple interactions in shops or on the street.

# About Paris 1

## Three Major Disciplinary Areas

The Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne offers courses in three disciplinary areas: economics and management, arts and humanities and law and political science. This broad range of courses makes Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne the largest French university in humanities and social sciences, in terms of both the variety of subjects taught and the number of students.

Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne University has always emphasised interdisciplinary education and research. Today the university offers a number of innovative double degrees at both bachelor's and master's levels with excellent reputations in France and abroad.

Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne University is very well placed in several international rankings. It particularly stands out in the latest 2025 QS World University Rankings by subject, where nine of its academic fields are ranked in the global top 50.

## A Research-Driven University

Teaching and research are intrinsically linked at Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne University. As with teaching, research is also structured around three major disciplinary areas with 37 research units (24 of which are in partnership with the French National Centre for Scientific Research and/or the National Research Institute for Sustainable Development) and 10 doctoral schools. Every year, more than 300 PhD theses and HDR (habilitations to supervise research) are defended at the university.

## International Outlook

More than 20% of the university's 45,000 students are international students enrolled across the institution's 10 academic departments and four institutes. Internationalisation of teaching and research at Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne is constantly increasing thanks to strong historic links with a large number of global institutions (more than 320 partners in over 70 countries) and the university's involvement in a number of networks. This great international presence makes it possible for Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne University to offer international joint supervision of PhDs, Erasmus

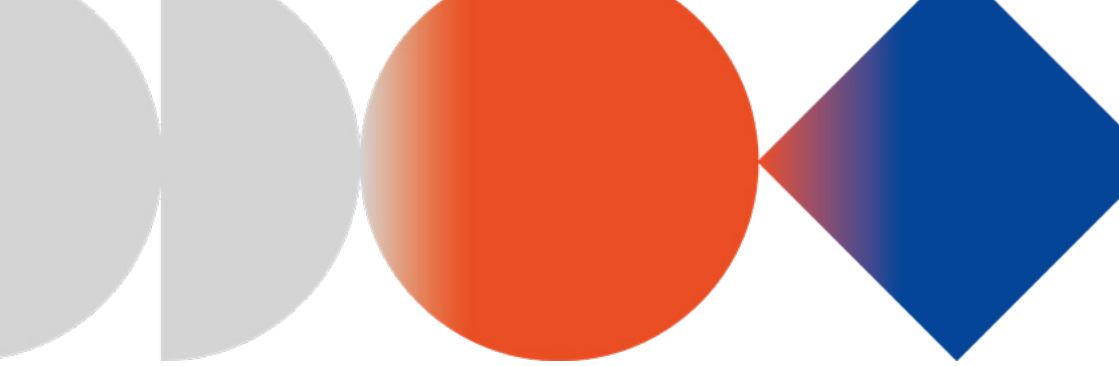
Mundus programmes, joint degree programmes, and many delocalised degrees within foreign partner universities.
