This specialization allows students to deepen their core skills and knowledge in Economics. They will follow beginner and advanced classes in microeconomics, macroeconomics, and the history of economic thoughts with French bachelor students. They will also choose elective courses in line with their personal interests.

Courses mostly take place at Centre Pierre Mendès France, 90 rue de Tolbiac, Paris 13.

Important prerequisites: a B2 level in French language, as well as a solid background in mathematics.

Course 2 Fondamentaux 1 - Macroéconomie

This course consists of two parts held simultaneously. A first course aims at presenting the way in which the major macro-economic aggregates of the National Accounts are defined and elaborated, such as GDP, growth, consumption, investment, public debt, and public deficit, etc. The second course focuses on the effects of monetary, fiscal and exchange rate policies in the framework of the IS/LM model in an open economy (Mundell-Fleming model).

Course 3 Fondamentaux 2 - Microéconomie

This course consists of two parts held simultaneously. A first course presents the producer and consumer theories. A second course is more advanced and explores the theoretical representations of imperfect competition (monopolies and duopolies) in partial equilibrium.
