

Minor in Law

The minor in “Law” offers an advanced training in French legal system. The total ECTS of the Minor courses will be 18. Students should make their choices according to the ECTS of each of the ten following courses.

Courses are held at Campus Port-Royal: Centre Lourcine: 1 rue de la Glacière, Paris 13, Centre Cassin: 17 rue Saint-Hippolyte, Paris 13.

All the courses will be taught in French and require a B2 level in French Language.

Description of course

Course 6 Political Theory and political ideas				
Students can choose different courses among the 10 following courses.

Relations internationales et introduction au droit international <i>This is an introductory course to public international law. The course aims to explain the basic structure of the law of treaties and the most important actors in international law.</i>	French	6	2	36
Droit de la famille <i>This course is an introductory course in civil law for the understanding of family legal relations in France.</i>	French	6	2	36
Droit des affaires <i>This course aims to show the legal regulation of traders and commercial acts. The course will focus on the status of traders and their legal rights.</i>	French	6	4	36
Droit fiscal <i>This course examines the power of the French State to raise taxes and the basic classification of taxes that exist today in France.</i>	French	6	4	36

Procédure pénale <i>This course introduces students to the rules regarding public prosecution in France. It will also show the influence of human rights law in the domain of criminal proceedings.</i>	French	6	4	36
Droit judiciaire privé <i>This course introduces students to procedural rules for private lawsuits.</i>	French	4	6	24
Introduction au droit comparé <i>This course aims to present the methodological requirements in contemporary comparative law. After a theoretical discussion, the course will be focusing on the comparison between common law and civil law systems.</i>	French	4	6	24
Droit du commerce international <i>Common rules for economic activities are fundamental for international trade. This course will introduce students to some of the most important international business contracts, such as purchase and sale.</i>	French	4	6	24
Droit public des affaires <i>This course will examine the law of relations between the public authorities and economic operators. It covers what is generally known as public economic law (administration of the economy and public enterprises) and public procurement law.</i>	French	6	6	36
Histoire de la justice et de la procédure <i>This course is an introductory course for students interested in the evolution of French judiciary system and its civil procedure.</i>	French	4	6	24
